We also host children's movies for our neighborhood friends to enjoy on weekends.

USE THE WATERFRONT SOUTH THEATRE

The Waterfront South Theatre is available throughout the year to host your show, event, meeting or performances. The auditorium seats 99 and includes accessible seating for four to six individuals. Our lobby is suitable to host parties and gatherings, too.

PLANNING YOUR VISIT TO WATERFRONT SOUTH

Visit one of the restaurants or bars highlighted in this brochure that help support the theatre. There are also several restaurants in Camden and nearby Gloucester City to visit before or after the show.

PARKING

When you visit us, park for free on Jasper or 4th streets or in one of two parking lots in the neighborhood. There is a lot just behind the Sacred Heart Church and one around the corner on Broadway across from the FireWorks gallery and artist loft space.

TICKET COST

Purchase your ticket(s) online or at the box office. Tickets are \$20 each plus a \$2.50 fee when purchased online. The fee is currently waived at our box office. If you live in Camden you qualify for our \$5 resident ticketing program. Simply show proof of residency at the box office and our partners from The Holman Enterprise Group and Subaru will cover the difference in the cost of your ticket.

FLEXPASS SAVINGS

Purchasing a four-show FlexPass will save you money. Your pass costs just \$70 plus a \$5.00 fee. You'll save \$15 on four individual tickets and fees. When you purchase a FlexPass we'll save a seat for you. If you can't make your scheduled show simply call our office 24 hours in advance and we'll move your tickets to another show of your choice.

SEASON 13 — CELEBRATING FEMALE PLAYWRIGHTS — 2018

The first show of our 13th season is a delightful, laugh-aminute comedy in which four unique Southern women, needing to escape their day-to-day routines, are drawn together by fate and an impromptu happy hour. Join them as they decide that it's high time to reclaim the enthusiasm for life they've lost through the years. The Savannah Sipping Society is a regional premiere and will be directed by Randall McCann.

Artemisia Gentileschi changed the history of art for women, yet is widely unknown outside the art community. Artemisia's experiments with the color palette created "Gentileschi amber" and developed new ways to color and fix paintings. Artemisia is a wild ride of fact and fantasy that takes you through the damp canals, cathedrals, and studios of Venice with malingering artists, murderous courtesans, and malicious barmaids. It is a celebration of art, women in art, and a lesson that history is bound to repeat itself, in art as in life. Artemisia, a world premiere, was written and is directed by Philadelphia playwright, Lee Kiszonas.

Our third show of this season takes you "down-the-shore" after hurricane Sandy has made landfall. We proudly present the regional premiere of By The Water written by Sharyn Rothstein. This show will grip you in its heartfelt story of a couple and their family dealing with this natural disaster and its effects on their home, family and lives.

The fourth show of the season was written by two-time Pulitzer Prize winner Lynn Nottage and is being directed by Connie Norwood. Join us as our theatre transforms to 1950's Brooklyn for **Crumbs From The Table Of Joy**. Meet Godfrey Crump, an African American man grieving over his wife's death, as he finds new meaning in religion. He has moved his family, Ernestine, a 17-year-old, and Ermina, 15 years old, from Florida to Brooklyn. Their Aunt Lily espouses Communist sentiments and Godfrey's new wife is not only a white woman, but German.
