As the battleground for nearly 300 major military engagements—and hundreds more skirmishes—it's no wonder New Jersey has been proclaimed the *Crossroads of the American Revolution*. **Explore the historic sites, memorials and monuments all around the state, including at the Northern New Jersey stops featured below.**

DAY 1



George Washington Bridge, Fort Lee

The Fight Comes To Fort Lee

Scout out a reconstructed war encampment at **Fort Lee Historic Park**, built upon the site of a significant American Revolution confrontation that took place in November 1776 between General George Washington's Continental Army and advancing British Troops.

Delve more deeply into this sophisticated riverside city's past at

the **Fort Lee Museum** and pay your respects to the fallen at **Monument Park**, the only park in the country dedicated to soldiers of the American Revolution.

Lunchtime is the right time to visit Fort Lee's **Main Street Shopping Corridor** for eclectic dining and browsing.

DAY 2



Cannon Ball House, Springfield

Last Showdown in Springfield

The Battle of Springfield marked the American Revolution's final fight in the North, but you can still witness evidence of the combat at five landmarks...

Contact the [Springfield Historical Society](#) for a group or private tour of the aptly-named **Cannon Ball House**—or visit during one of its open house events.

Then be sure to hit the **[Colonial Church & Cemetery and Battle of Springfield Monument](#)**, the **[Battleground Cemetery](#)** and the **[Presbyterian Gateway Cemetery](#)**.

From diners and delis to pizzerias and bakeries, you can find the best eats and treats in town in the **[Springfield Business Improvement District](#)**.

DAY 3



Morris Museum, Morristown

Continental Might at Morristown

Make a day of it in Morristown, home to a [bustling downtown](#), [local cultural scene](#) and key American Revolution locations.

Stroll the quaint **[Morristown Green](#)** with its treasure-trove of historical markers and have lunch with our first-ever President and his First Lady at **[George + Martha's American Grille](#)**.

Visit **[Morristown National Historical Park](#)** to check out four must-see American Revolution attractions: Fort Nonsense, Ford Mansion, New Jersey Brigade Area and Jockey Hollow encampment area.

If time allows, expand your mind at the **[Morris Museum](#)**, a Smithsonian Affiliate, with the mission of "interpreting the past, discovering the future, through art, sound, and motion."
