# DAY 1

# Frenchtown, Stockton and Lambertville Heritage

Journey south along Route 29 on the 34-mile <u>Delaware River Scenic</u>

<u>Byway.</u> Also a National Scenic

Byway, it's one of the most significant routes in the U.S., passing storied

American Revolution and Industrial Revolution sites.

Begin with breakfast in <u>Frenchtown</u> at farm-to-table <u>Frenchtown Cafe</u>. Head for <u>Delaware and Raritan</u> <u>Canal State Park</u>, and bike, hike, kayak, fish and more on serene

waters and historic towpath <u>trails</u>. In <u>Stockton</u>, tour the late-1700s <u>Prallsville Mills</u> complex of industrial structures, including a grist mill, linseed oil mill, saw mill and granary.

# **Patriotic Time in Titusville and Trenton**

March on to <u>Washington Crossing</u>
<u>State Park</u> (Titusville). That's where, on December 25, 1776, General George Washington and his soldiers landed their iconic, icy river crossing and set off a pivotal chain of won battles. Explore the Johnson Ferry House and museum, as well as the tree-lined trails, spotting wildlife and seasonal wildflowers.

In <u>Trenton</u>, visit the colonial-era <u>Old Barracks Museum</u>, the <u>New Jersey State House</u> capitol building, the <u>Trenton City Museum</u> and the <u>New Jersey State Museum</u>.

Hungry? All-American fare beckons at **1911 Smoke House Bar-B-Que**. Or sample food, Jersey Fresh produce and specialty items at the beloved **Trenton Farmers Market**. Leave room for **Halo Farm's** heavenly ice cream, next door!

## DAY 3

# **Captivating Culture in Monmouth County**

Loop the 24-mile <u>Upper Freehold</u> <u>Scenic Byway</u>, a tranquil blend of vintage, small-town charm and preserved farmland.

Start on Main Street in Allentown, where the landmark Old Mill offers waterfront dining, art and craft shops and studios, and nature trail access. Equine enthusiasts should trot over for Horse Park of New Jersey events.

See Ye Olde Yellow Meeting House and cemetery (Imlaystown) from 1737, New Jersey's oldest Baptist Meeting House. At Historic Walnford, tour an elegant 1774 home, a 19th-century gristmill and farm buildings set in a lovely landscape.

During your travels, savor places like Cream Ridge Winery, Screamin Hill Farm Brewery (Cream Ridge) and La Piazza Ristorante (Allentown).

## There's Even More to See and Do

Extend your stay and add these on:

### Must-Stop, One-of-a-Kind Shops

Factor in seemingly infinite, unique shopping. Examples: Frenchtown's **Merge Gallery** for art, antiques and furniture, **Frenchtown Pottery** for handmade ceramics and **The Spinnery**, slinging yarn.

### **Settle in to Historic Accommodations**

Frenchtown offers 1800s appeal at the <u>Widow McCrea House</u>
B&B and <u>The National Hotel</u>. Opt for Stockton's <u>Woolverton Inn</u>, a stunning, 1792 stone manor. Get 1812 ambience at <u>Lambertville</u>
<u>House</u> and an on-site classic tavern at <u>The Hawke</u> (Lambertville).
